To Whom It May Concern:

The New Hampshire Music Educators Association provides educational support services for the music teachers and students of the public and private school systems of New Hampshire. Some of these support services and performance venues are All-State and Jazz All-State Festivals, Elementary and Middle School Festivals, Large Group and Solo/Ensemble Festivals.

In order to provide these services and to fund activities for students and educational professionals, a School District Participation Fee is levied on each school district based upon enrollment as listed in the New Hampshire Department of Education Bureau of Data Management. NHMEA tabulates anticipated fees based on the figures reported as of October 2010.

The general fee schedule for the 2011-2012 school year is determined by the total school district population:

1-100 students:	\$60.00	2,501-3,500 students:	\$140.00
101-500 students:	\$80.00	3,501-4,500 students:	\$150.00
501-1,000 students:	\$90.00	4,501-5,500 students:	\$160.00
1,001-1,500 students:	\$100.00	5,501-10,000 students:	\$180.00
1,501-2,000 students:	\$110.00	10,001+ students:	\$200.00
2,001-2,500 students:	\$130.00		

In addition, each district wishing to participate must pay a fee determined by the student population in grades 9-12 of that district. The high school fee schedule is:

1-150 students:	\$70.00	1,001-1,500 students:	\$150.00
151-300 students:	\$90.00	1,501-2,000 students:	\$180.00
301-600 students:	\$110.00	2,001+ students:	\$200.00
601-1,000 students:	\$130.00		

Please add your general fee and your high school fee (if there is a 9-12 student population in your district) to determine your total School District Participation Fee for this school year. To save on postage, SAUs with multiple districts should have multiple invoices enclosed in this mailing.
